This Agreement between the Subscribing Institution ("Subscriber") identified below and SPIE grants Subscriber and Authorized Users the right to use SPIE Journals Online, the online versions of SPIE Journals, subject to the terms and conditions set forth below. It becomes effective on receipt by SPIE of the Agreement signed by an authorized person and remains in effect while Subscriber maintains a current subscription to one or more SPIE Journals.

LICENSE

SPIE grants to Subscriber and Authorized Users access to the SPIE Journals Online for which Subscriber maintains a current subscription. Authorized Users are Subscriber's employees, faculty, staff, and students and persons with authorized on-site access to Subscriber's library collections and facilities. Post-termination access to licensed content is available via Portico.

Permitted uses by Subscriber and Authorized Users:

- Download, save, or print text, search results, or other information for research, teaching, and private study, including e-reserves and coursepacks.
- Brief quotations from online texts with customary acknowledgment of the source.
- Supply a single-paper copy of an article to an Authorized User of a library within the same country by post, fax, or secure transmission, using Ariel or its equivalent, for the purposes of research, teaching, or private study only (Interlibrary Loan or ILL). All such activity must comply with the CONTU Guidelines on Photocopying under Interlibrary Loan Arrangements. The use of articles that exceeds

CONTU limits must be accompanied by payment of the Item Fee to SPIE or to the Copyright Clearance Center. Except as noted above, under no circumstance may Subscriber transmit an electronic file for an article to any person or entity not an Authorized User.

Prohibited activities:

- Altering, recompiling, systematic copying, reselling, redistributing, publishing or republishing (beyond the brief quotations allowed above), or Internet posting of any journal text or search results. SPIE Journals Online are subject to all applicable copyright, database protection, and other rights of the stated owner and publisher under the laws of the United States and other countries.
- Removing, obscuring, or modifying in any way copyright or other publication notices in SPIE Journals Online.

APPENDIX: INSTITUTIONAL IP ADDRESSES/RANGES FOR SPIE ONLINE JOURNALS

Note: SPIE Journals Online are components of the SPIE Digital Library (www.spiedl.org). The American Institute of Physics administers the Scitation platform on which the SPIE Digital Library is hosted and provides technical support and site administration for SPIE Journals Online.

SPIE Journals Online has enabled IP-address-based access control for institutional subscribers. Each computer that accesses the Internet is assigned an IP address, commonly represented as four number groups separated by periods (e.g., 192.58.150.10). All computers on a local area network, or subnet, may have the first two or three number groups in common. Access to **SPIE Journals Online** from your institution will be authorized based on the IP addresses and/or ranges you provide. Each IP or IP range must be dedicated for sole use by the Subscriber and Authorized Users. (It is recommended that you consult with your network administrator to determine your IP addresses, subnets, and other critical information about your institution's network configuration.)

SPIE will accept up to ten IP addresses and/or ranges (Class B, Class C, and single station) via this form (attach additional sheets as necessary). Note that Class B requests will be subject to additional review.
